Special Opry Night will be staged on Wednesday, September 15, at Faith Chapel Christian Center in North Bay. The show begins at 7:00 PM and tickets are free from the office and members of Faith Chapel Christian Center or by calling (705) 476-5704.

Grand Ole Opry Star George Hamilton IV will headline this special show.

Hamilton was born on July 19, 1937, in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. He began performing in the late 1950s as a teen idol, later switching to country and folk music.

Hit songs such as "A Rose and a Baby Ruth", "Before This Day Ends", "Abilene", "Fort Worth, Dallas or Houston", "Steel Rail Blues" and "Early Morning Rain". "Urge For Going", "Break My Mind", "Canadian Pacific." and "She's a Little Bit Country" are just a few of the memorable music favorites of this Musical Troubadour.

On February 8, 1960, Hamilton officially became a member of the Grand Ole Opry and has toured the world, across the Soviet Union, Australia, the Middle East and East Asia. These widely-acclaimed international performances earned Hamilton the nickname 'The International Ambassador of Country Music'.

Hamilton is still a regular at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville and in country shows throughout the U.S. and the UK. Today he mainly concentrates on gospel tours both at home and abroad. In 2007 he collaborated with a group of musicians from Northern Ireland called 'Live Issue' to record a live album based on the life of Joseph Scriven, who wrote the hymn, "What A Friend We Have in Jesus."
